- 5.3 Scoring events will be as follows:  
 Number of events run 10 – the best 8 scores to count.  
 Number of events run 9 – the best 7 scores to count.  
 Number of events run 8 – the best 6 scores to count.  
 Number of events run 7 – the best 5 scores to count.  
 Number of events run 6 – the best 5 scores to count.  
 If 5 or less rounds are run, all events to count.

Where there is a tie it will be resolved in the following order:

- a) Ties will be decided in favour of the competitors with the greater number of maximum scores in their counting score, then the greater number of second maximum scores and so on.
  - b) The competitor who has beaten the greater number of competitors in their class in achieving their counting score.
  - c) The competitors driving the car with the smallest engine capacity.
- 5.4 Once a competitor has registered it will not be possible for them to disclaim any points for which they become eligible.
- 5.5 In order to score points, all competitors must display Motorsport UK championship decals on either side of the vehicle at events. These decals are available from the Championship Co-ordinator.

The winner of each class will receive an award.

The winner of the Autotest Junior Trophy will receive an award.

**1. ANNOUNCEMENT**

1.1 The Championship will be run to these Regulations. Championship Permit Number: 2020/A/0700 has been issued by Motorsport UK

**2. ELIGIBLE COMPETITORS**

2.1 Any holder of a 2020 Competition Licence issued by either Motorsport UK or Motor Sport Ireland.

2.2 **Junior Trophy.** Any holder of a 2020 Competition Licence issued by either Motorsport UK or Motor Sport Ireland and is registered for this Championship as detailed in 3 below. In order to qualify, competitors must be 25 or under on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020.

**3. REGISTRATION**

3.1 Competitors must register with Motorsport UK before any points can be scored. Registration must be made on the official form, and must be accompanied by the fee of £20.00. All registrations will be acknowledged. Registration can also be made with the Championship Co-ordinator. Registration can be made any time up to the start of the final round. Points will not be awarded retrospectively. **Please note that the Championship Liaison Officer may not be at every round, so registration should be made in advance to ensure the correct allocation of points.**

**4. CARS ELIGIBLE**

4.1 The Championship is open to drivers of cars complying with Section M4, M12 and M13 of the 2020 Motorsport UK Yearbook.

4.2 Classes

- (A) Saloon cars under 11ft overall length (including Minis with non-original engine and transmission layout driving the front wheels)
- (B) Saloon cars over 11ft overall length.
- (C) Sports Cars and Sports Kit Cars.
- (D) Specials.
- (E) Road Going Series Production Cars.

Class E - All Saloons and Sports Cars produced in quantities of not less than 1000 over a 12 month period. All vehicles in this class must be capable of being driven on the road, must be taxed with a valid MoT (if applicable), documents to be produced at signing on.

('Saloons' will include estate cars, hatchbacks and commercial types as appropriate as well as saloon type Kit Cars. Cabriolets will run in the appropriate classes depending on whether the top is raised or lowered. Overall length of the vehicle will include bumpers whether fitted or not).

4.3 Tyres from Motorsport UK Permitted Tyres List 1B are and 1C are **NOT** permitted.

**5. SCORING**

5.1 Points will be awarded to registered competitors relative to their position overall and in each class as follows, the two scores are then added together to provide the overall score for each competitor:

1st overall	: 20 points	1st in class	: 10 points
2nd overall	: 19 points	2nd in class	: 9 points
3rd overall	: 18 points	3rd in class	: 8 points
4th overall	: 17 points	4th in class	: 7 points
5th overall	: 16 points	5th in class	: 6 points
6th overall	: 15 points	6th in class	: 5 points
7th overall	: 14 points	7th in class	: 4 points
8th overall	: 13 points	8th in class	: 3 points
9th overall	: 12 points	9th in class	: 2 points
10 <sup>th</sup> overall	: 11 points	10th in class	: 1 point
11 <sup>th</sup> overall	: 10 points		
and so on down to 19 <sup>th</sup> overall	: 2 points		

All other classified finishers will receive 1 point.

5.2 Where there are less than ten competitors in a class there will be no reduction in points awarded.
